

## Advisory for Parent/Guardian on Hearing Screening Test

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Health Promotion Board's School Health Service team conducts a hearing screening test as part of your child's/ward's annual health screening in school.

No abnormality has been detected in the hearing screening test done for your child/ward.

However, parents/guardians are advised to seek further medical attention, should they notice their child/ward having or developing the following symptoms:

Does your child/ward:

- 1. Turn up the volume of the TV excessively high?
- 2. Respond inappropriately to questions?
- 3. No reply when you call him/her?
- 4. Watch others to imitate what they are doing?
- 5. Have articulation problems or speech/language delays?
- 6. Have learning problems?
- 7. Complain of earaches or head noises?
- 8. Have difficulty understanding what people are saying?

These symptoms indicate that your child/ward may have a hearing problem. If you feel that your child/ward may have difficulty in hearing, it would be advisable to bring him/her to consult a doctor for further assessment.
